Octaviana V. Trujillo, Ph.D is a founding Chair and professor at the Department of Applied Indigenous Studies at Northern Arizona University (NAU), Flagstaff, USA. The primary focus of her work has been developing educational programs including certificated ones. She teaches courses and leads Ph.D. research in selected aspects of the Environmental policy and community engagement. She is the NAU research, education and training co-director of the Center for American Indian Resilience (CAIR). Professor Trujillo, the National Council for Science and Environment and American Indian Higher Education Consortium have partnered to develop and augment Tribal College and Universities (TCU) to enlarge knowledge and skills in climate research, education and community engagement through increased awareness of climate change learning materials and enhance student learning in academic programs.

Dr. Trujillo has extended her professional focus into the international arena; with National Institutes of Health (North Carolina, USA) funded “Native Americans exploring Global Health Disparities” project which proposes to provide short-term global research training opportunities for qualified Native American students and others who are underrepresented in the life, social, and health sciences.

Dr. Trujillo served on local, national and international governing boards, including the US Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA), Governmental Advisory Committee (GAC), which helps shape U.S. policies that improve the environment and health conditions of the United States, Canada, and Mexico.

Recently professor Trujillo was nominated by President Obama to U.S.A. Key Administrative List to be a member of the Joint Public Advisory Committee of the Commission for Environmental Cooperation and is actively involved in Global Climate Change policy, including Paris Negotiations.
